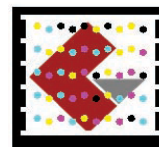

ADULT ED DELIVERS TOP-NOTCH TRAINING

## 95% of Adult Career Students Land Jobs

**C**uyahoga Valley Career Center's Adult Education classes offer residents the ability to retool their skills and enter or advance in the 21st Century workforce.

In 2010-11, 228 adult students who took classes in health careers became certified or licensed dental assistants, medical assistants, practical nurses, EKG technicians, phlebotomists and emergency medical technicians.

learned new computer skills to meet unique job requirements.

Keeping pace with ever-changing technology, 362 adults took computer classes ranging from introductory level Microsoft applications to instruction in graphic design and web produc-

tion. Eight students completed training in Heating/Ventilation/Air Conditioning, Computer Numerical Control, Programmable Logic Controllers and Electrical Apprenticeship classes. Many students were sent by local companies to learn new skills needed for advanced level jobs.

Through CVCC's customized training program, which sends instructors to the workplace, 182 people at local businesses

Following successful completion of academic coursework, clinical experiences and externships, the most recent pass rates on state and national certification and licensing exams are as follows:

In as few as five months, CVCC's Adult Education programs in health care and public safety offer students the education needed to gain certifications that document skills and training.

The Adult Education department's most recent performance data show 95% of students who completed career programs find employment.

These pass rates are consistently above the state and national average and are indicative of the quality education at CVCC.

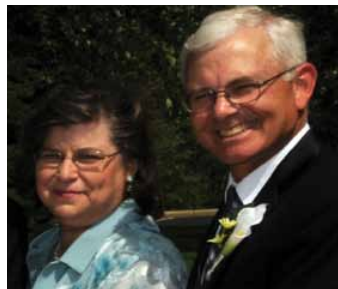

- ◆ **STUDENT JOB FAIR** - 970 students, 300 parents and 39 employers participated. Employers interviewed and hired students for part-time, seasonal and volunteer positions. (Next Job Fair Thursday, March 8, 2012.)
- ◆ **JOB-SEEKER SERIES** - 340 adults attended the series, featuring assistance with career assessments, résumé preparation, interviewing skills and more. (Next Job-Seeker event Saturday, Oct. 1, 10 to 11:15 a.m.)
- ◆ **SUMMER CAREER CAMPS** - 300 students entering eighth, ninth and 10th



High school students acquired ample information on careers in Science, Technology, Engineering and Math during our third annual STEM career expo featuring several northeast Ohio companies, professionals in these fields and numerous colleges showcasing related programs.

- grades attended summer career camps that allowed them to experience one of 15 careers.
- ◆ **CAREER EXPLORATION** - 2,200 middle school students explored career activities and assessments here at CVCC during February, March and April.
- ◆ **STEM EXPO** - 300 students and parents attended this event featuring 44 companies and professional organizations.
- ◆ **SEMINARS FOR PARENTS** - 243 parents and students attended FREE seminars on "College and Career Planning," "Career Assessments" and "College Survival Skills 101." (Next seminar: "College and Career Planning" for Parents and Students - Wednesday, Nov. 9, 7 to 9 p.m.)

◆ **COLLEGE NIGHT** - Nearly 2,000 students and parents met with 135 college representatives, sponsored by 10 area high schools and CVCC. (Next College Night Oct. 5, 6 to 7:30 p.m.)

◆ **"IT's FOR GIRLS,"** a forum designed to foster interest in Information Technology (IT) careers, included 64 young women and 32 professionals. (Next forum Friday, Dec. 9.)

◆ **GLASS CEILING LEADERSHIP SEMINAR** - More than 50 junior and senior girls representing five high schools converged at CVCC for a motivational talk and sessions to help them prepare for a successful future.

◆ **YOUNG MEN IN MEDICINE** - 42 Middle school boys who expressed an interest in science, physiology or biology learned about the variety of careers available in health care by participating in interactive activities and having lunch with health care professionals.

◆ **HER IDEAS IN MOTION** - 50 girls participated in a web design workshop sponsored by CVCC and Rachel Wilkins Patel, owner, Bridge Interactive LLC. Ms. Patel and other women IT professionals, artists and designers introduced girls to careers in media science.

## It's Right in Your Own Backyard

### Did You Know ALL this about CVCC?

- ◆ Cuyahoga Valley Career Center (CVCC) serves people of all ages who reside in our eight associate districts: Brecksville-Broadview Heights, Cuyahoga Heights, Garfield Heights, Independence, Nordonia Hills, North Royalton, Revere and Twinsburg.
- ◆ On Nov. 8, CVCC will have a 1 mill renewal levy on the election ballot. The 25 communities that compose the eight associate school districts served by CVCC have renewed this 1 mill levy repeatedly since 1982, attesting to our quality career programs and training.
- ◆ When you view your Nov. 8 election ballot, you may see not only CVCC's renewal issue, but also an issue for your local school district.
- ◆ Millage is not transferable between associate school districts and CVCC. Passage of the 1 mill renewal levy will not increase or decrease tax dollars for associate districts. Likewise, passage of millage in associate districts does

not generate additional dollars for CVCC.

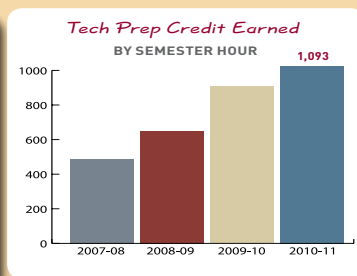
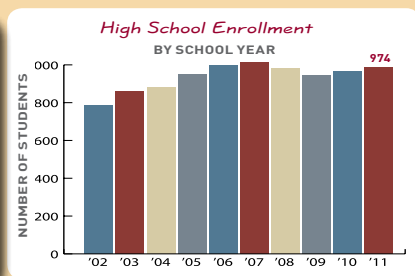
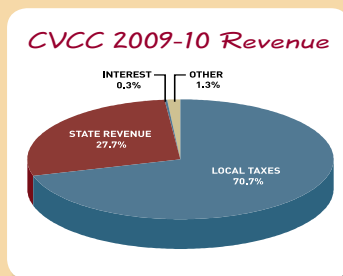
- ◆ All CVCC and associate district students -- K-12, even if they attend parochial schools, are offered Career Development activities, such as career portfolios, job shadowing, mock interviewing, as well as job placement, internships and career coaching.
- ◆ Employers of CVCC students have said, "yes," to the question: "Would you hire another CVCC student?" (Answers span school years '04-'05 to '10-'11.)

- ◆ Percentage of CVCC grads who pursue higher education continues to rise: (Answers span school years '04-'05 to '10-'11.)

- ◆ College credit (Tech Prep) earned by our high school students (see chart) while they attend CVCC continues to increase. In 2011, 103 students collectively earned 1,093 credit hours.

- ◆ In 2011, 224 students were eligible to receive college credit via the Ohio Tech Prep initiative, and more than \$60,000 in scholarship money was awarded to CVCC seniors.
- ◆ CVCC offers many career programs for people with special needs, so that they may enter the workforce.
- ◆ CVCC was recently ranked #1 out of the 91 Career-Technical Planning Districts (CTPD's) in Ohio, according to the Ohio Career-Technical Education 2009-2010 Secondary CTPD Workforce Development Performance Reports.
- ◆ Based on 2010 data, 96% of our high school graduates go to work or college, or both, and 95% of adults go to work.
- ◆ CVCC offers discounted services to our communities, such as lunches at the student-operated restaurant, salon services and special event facilities.
- ◆ CVCC Adult Education is accredited

by the North Central Association (NCA) Commission on Accreditation and School Improvement, an accreditation division of AdvancED®.

- ◆ In the past five years, CVCC Adult Education trained 343 practical nurses, plus 1,312 other healthcare providers including EMT's, EKG technicians, STNA's, medical assistants, dental assistants and phlebotomists.
- ◆ CVCC provided more than 70 Northeast Ohio companies with customized training over the past five years. This training provides employers with a skilled workforce to meet current, ever-evolving, industry demands.
- ◆ CVCC Adult Education teamed up with Microsoft Corporation to offer "Elevate America," a program providing free training and certification that helped 555 people in the greater Cleveland area upgrade their technology skills to the standard needed for employment.

\*The chart below (far right) represents the number of tuition-free college credit hours earned the last four school years. Considering the current cost of a Tri-C semester hour (\$91.22), CVCC graduates saved \$99,703 based on the 1,093 hours they earned in 2010-11. If a student transfers those credits to a four-year institution, such as the University of Akron which costs \$385.19/credit hour, the savings becomes \$421,000! Copies of our Annual Report are available in our School Treasurer's office.
